

CONDITIONALS	
First Conditional	
If + Present Simple	= Present Simple
If you have water to 100 degrees, it boils.	
If you study hard, you will pass the exam.	
Second Conditional	
If + Present Simple	= will = bezokolicznik
If she comes home, I will tell her about the exam.	
If I had more money, I would buy a car.	
Third Conditional	
If + Past Simple	= would = bezokolicznik
If I were you, I would follow his advice.	
If I had known, I would have helped you.	
Future Conditional	
If + Present Simple	= Future Perfect in the Past
If I had met Susan last week, I would have given her the book.	
Future Conditional	
If + Present Simple	= Future Perfect
If you find out what I said, you will be rich now.	
If I had more money, I would buy a car.
